to learn from my mistakes, or the confessions of a self taught woodturner. Along the way, Compton provided considerable insight into how to use the various tools correctly. At the same time Buddy insisted we learn what works for us and use it without worrying over someone's insistance we are doing it all wrong.

Deep Hollowing Tool Raffle

Thanks to a donation by Kay Agnew, the club will be raffling a Jamieson Hollowing System during the next few month.

Tickets for the hollowing tool are on sale now for \$5 or five tickets for \$20. Drawing will be held July 6th at our regular meeting.

The Jamieson system includes a 3/4 in boring bar which should reach 18 inches safely. It uses the laser guide for inside turning. This model seems stable and resistant to jarring and vibration.


